AEP OHIO SCHEDULES OPEN HOUSE TO DISCUSS TRANMISSION LINE REBUILD IN NORTHWEST OHIO

GAHANNA, Ohio, April 26, 2017 – AEP Ohio, a utility subsidiary of American Electric Power (NYSE: AEP), today announced a \$20 million upgrade to its electric transmission infrastructure in northwest Ohio. This project will allow AEP Ohio to continue to provide reliable service to its customers in the region.

Project components include:

- Rebuilding approximately 12-miles of existing 69 kilovolt (kV) transmission line
- Building approximately 2-miles of new 69 kV line
- Removing approximately 2-miles of line

AEP Ohio's project is located in Pleasant and Union townships in Van Wert County and Blue Creek Township in Paulding County.

To learn more about this project, the public is invited to attend an open house on May 4 from 5:30 - 7:30 p.m.at Van Wert High School located at 10708 OH-118 in Van Wert. The informational open house provides residents the opportunity to meet and talk with project representatives. There is no formal presentation. Visitors may come and go at any time. Residents can offer input, ask questions of project team members and learn more about the project.

Construction is targeted to begin in early 2019 and be complete by the end of 2019.
