AEP Ohio Schedules Open House to Discuss Electric Transmission Line

AEP Ohio and its affiliate, AEP Ohio Transmission Company Inc., invite residents to attend a public informational open house regarding plans to upgrade an electric transmission line in Jackson County.

To learn more about this project, the public is invited to attend a project open house **August 9 at Westview Elementary School, 16349 Beaver Pike, Jackson, Ohio 45640. Doors open at 5:30 p.m.** The open house will run until 7:30 p.m. The informational open house provides the public the opportunity to meet and talk with project representatives. There is no formal presentation. Visitors may come and go at any time during the workshop. Residents can ask questions of project team members and learn more about the new transmission line.

The North Jackson 138 kV Transmission Line Project involves upgrading about 4 miles of 69-kilovolt (kV) transmission line to 138 kV. This project is located in Coal and Perry townships and the city of Jackson in Jackson County. This project supports local economic development and improves the electric transmission service in Jackson and the surrounding area. The upgraded line will use several structure types including steel single pole and H-frame structures. AEP Ohio anticipates completion of this project at the end of 2019. Early estimates show this is an approximate \$10 million investment.

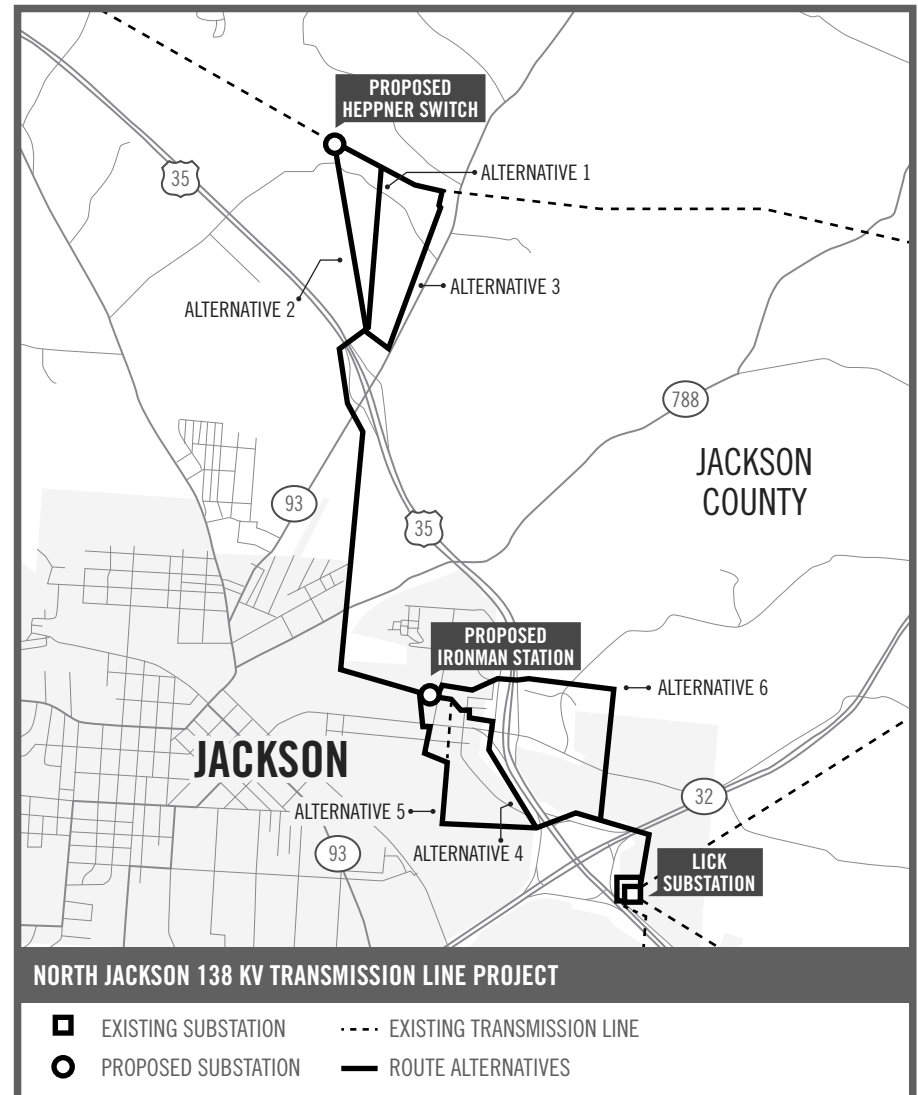
AEP Ohio Transmission Company anticipates filing a Letter of Notification for the North Jackson 138 kV Transmission Line Project with the Ohio Power Siting Board in early fall 2017.

The Ohio Power Siting Board is responsible for reviewing information related to the project – including input from the public – and determining whether the proposed project should be approved. It should be noted that due to reduced scale and limited detail, this map should be used only as a general guide.
